4) State Adult Education Update-Jerry Haffner, DWD

- a) DWD suggest the PDF system would be a vehicle to increase IAACE membership. There are 30 PDFs across the state. Dan Devers from DWD would be willing to share contact information for all PDFs.
- b) DWD spoke with DRC to advocate the importance of the HSE across the state and country. This is of concern because the number of HSE is decreasing across the country, including in Indiana. However, regionally, Indiana is higher achieving than other mid-western states.
- c) The US Department of Education now requires Integrated Education & Training.
- d) TABE Test was developed in 2002. It is not near the level of difficulty of TASC. Last October DRC submitted TABE 11 & 12 for approval to ensure it is reliable and valid test. Appointments at the federal level have not occurred and therefore; the approval process has slowed.
- e) NextLevelJobs.org was recently announced by the Governor. This program allocates 21 million dollars for students to enter training and for employers to train employees. Anyone who visits the website markings that they do not

have a HSE or HSD will be contacted by a DWD AE team member by phone. DWD will refer the students contact number and interest details to the local program Director/Coordinator.
