History of IAACE

History: The Indiana Association for Adult and Continuing Education is a state-wide association of over 400 individuals and their institutions promoting the education and training of adults for stronger Hoosier communities.

The organization evolved from a group of adult educators who first met in December 1943 to discuss the future of adult education in Indiana.

Over the following decades, many changes occurred in Indiana that affected all Hoosiers and caused a growing need for adult education. The group has changed with the times.

With the merging of two organizations concerned with the future of adult education, the current Indiana Association for Adult and Continuing Education was formed in 1983.

Our first president in 1983 was Timmie Westfall. The list of past officers, pictures and so much more is stored at the Ball State University Archives.

The Indiana Association for Adult and Continuing Education ("IAACE") has achieved several key advocacy accomplishments over the past five years. In 2020, IAACE developed and successfully lobbied for the passage of Indiana's High School Equivalency ("HSE") pilot program. The pilot program allows students in certain school districts who have completed less than fifty percent of the required number of credits necessary to graduate upon entering their fourth year of high school to earn a high school equivalency. Thus, the pilot program gives these students who otherwise would not have graduated from high school an alternative path for educational and career attainment.

Further, in 2023, IAACE successfully advocated for the increase in the Adult Education Distribution biennial appropriation from \$12,985,041 for Fiscal Years 2021-2023, to \$16,985,041 and \$20,985,041 for Fiscal Years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, respectively. Further, in 2025, IAACE successfully advocated to increase the appropriation to \$20,985,041 for Fiscal Years 2025-2027 in both the Governor's introduced budget, as well as the House and Senate passed versions of the budget. Due to a \$2.4 billion revenue shortfall that was identified in the final weeks of session, the appropriation was maintained at \$16,985,041 for Fiscal Years 2025-2027 in the final version of the budget. However, IAACE's strong advocacy efforts throughout the 2025 legislative session helped maintain the appropriation at \$16,985,041 when many other programs in the state budget were significantly reduced or cut altogether.







Managing Crash-outs Safely in an Adult Education Classroom! Craig BOYKIN

Craig J. Boykin has garnered national attention as a consultant, celebrated for his refreshingly candid approach to systemic poverty and trauma. Craig is unapologetic about speaking the hard truth. With a multifaceted career as an author, consultant, entrepreneur, and decorated Army veteran, Craig's achievements are a testament to his unyielding determination and perseverance. Having grown up with a single mother who struggled with addiction, Craig faced considerable challenges in his youth, including the absence of his father and an uncertain future. He repeated the 3rd and 5th grades, was diagnosed with a learning disability, and was placed in special education. Consequently, Craig experienced significant difficulties in school, was frequently expelled, and eventually dropped out in the 10th grade. Craig presently oversees forty students in a 24/7 psychiatric residential treatment facility as the Direct Care Manager. These students have been diagnosed with a range of emotional and behavioral disorders. Following a decade of consulting, in 2022, Craig took a 7th-grade teaching position at one of the most challenging middle schools in Montgomery, Alabama. Unlike most professional speakers who leave education to consult full-time, Craig transitioned from consulting to a full-time educator, demonstrating the sincerity of his commitment. Despite his daily involvement in the trenches, Craig remains a captivating presenter, delivering inspiring and actionable presentations.



Observing the success of these programs, workshops grew and were hosted at other schools, jails and non for profit groups, spanning more than 10 states. Tara moved to Indiana in 2021 with her family and continues to bring mindful wellness into communities. Her work has been published in local and national journals (including COAB & NEA) and she continues to explore the ways in which mindful wellness aides in communities such as the ones she works in now including a juvenile detention center and adult education. She uses her small farm to educate about wellness via nature and breath work sessions, as well as therapy animals, continuing to integrate mindful wellness into her work.
